

Remote Snow Days:
2020-2021 School Year

Dear Parents/Guardians,

In order to meet the state requirements for this school year, all **future** snow days for the remainder of 2020-2021 will be remote learning days for students. Teachers are preparing plans for students in the event that the school district will need to call a snow day. If future weather forecasts show that a snow day may be required, teachers may start preparing students for what a snow day will look like for them.

If your child is a 6th-12th grade student, lessons will be found online where students would normally go to get their work. A teacher will be in touch with your child by Google Meet to check-in. (**Note:**

Attendance will be taken at this time & if students do not log in, they will be counted absent for the day.)

- Campus High School: 9:00am (meet with Seminar)
- Haysville High School: 9:20am (meet with PLP Mon.-Thurs.) or 8:40am (meet with PLP Fri.)
- Haysville Middle School: 9:13am (meet with 3rd hour)
- Haysville West Middle School: 9:18am (meet with 3rd hour)

If your child is a PreK-5th grade student, a packet of lessons will be sent home prior to the snow day so your child will have what they need to work from home on that day. The snow day packet will have enough lessons for three snow days total in the event that the weather does not allow for school for more than one day. Your child's teacher will be in touch with your child either by phone or Google Meet sometime throughout the day to check-in and **take attendance for the day.**

The school district will continue to provide breakfast and lunch to students in the event of a snow day. **NO RESERVATIONS NEEDED** for snow day only. The meals will be grab and go from the following locations: **CHS**, **HMS**, & **Nelson**. The timeframe to pick up breakfast and lunch on snow days will be: **6:00am-7:00am** on the morning of the snow day.
